

## **Limited Visitation- (Outside)**

**Location:** Commons Park

**Days/times:** Monday-Friday 1pm-5pm (weather permitting)

- Visits to be by appointment only, in 1-hour blocks (total visitors in 1 hour- up to 20)
- No more than 10% of the residents shall have visitors at any one time and only two visitors will be allowed per resident at any one time.

**Canopy Tents:** 10 tents will be set up throughout Commons park

- maintaining 6-feet social distancing between the tents.
- Each tent will be set up as follows: a table in the center of the tent, on the ground a line will be placed to keep the 6-foot social distancing.
- Resident will sit on one side of the table and the visitor(s) will sit on the other side.
- Hand sanitizer (consisting of at least 60% alcohol) will be available throughout Commons Park.
- Easy to read fact sheet-- will be posted throughout tents, outlining visitor expectations including appropriate hand hygiene and face coverings. residents and visitors to wear facemasks throughout visit.

**Who is allowed to visit:** family members, loved ones, representatives from the long-term care ombudsman program (LTCOP), and resident advocacy organizations.

### **Staff:**

- are present to allow for personnel to help with the transition of residents, monitoring of visitation, and cleaning and disinfecting areas used for visitation after each visit using an EPA-approved disinfectant.

### **Residents:**

- Resident's will wear a facemask when they leave their room and keep it on throughout their visit.
- Staff will bring the residents who has a visitor out the front door to Commons Park to the assigned tent.
- Residents who are on the 14 day quarantine or observation period are not eligible for visits.

### **Visitors:**

- Will come in main entrance, to be screened for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 prior to resident access.
- Visitation will be refused if the visitor(s) exhibits any COVID-19 symptoms or do not pass the screening questions.

- Screening shall consist of both temperature checks and screening questions to assess potential exposure to COVID-19 which shall include questions regarding international travel or travel to other states designated under the Commissioner's travel advisory.
- Easy to read fact sheet- will be posted for visitors to read before visit
- Documentation must include the following for each visitor to the nursing home.: first and last name of the visitor; physical (street) address of the visitor; daytime and evening telephone number; date and time of visit; and email address, if available.
- Remind visitor(s) they need to wear a facemask and follow 6-feet social distancing during the whole visit
- Visitor will then go out to Commons Park to the assigned tent for the visit
- If any visitor fails to adhere to the protocol, they will be prohibited from visiting for the duration of the COVID-19 state declared public health emergency.

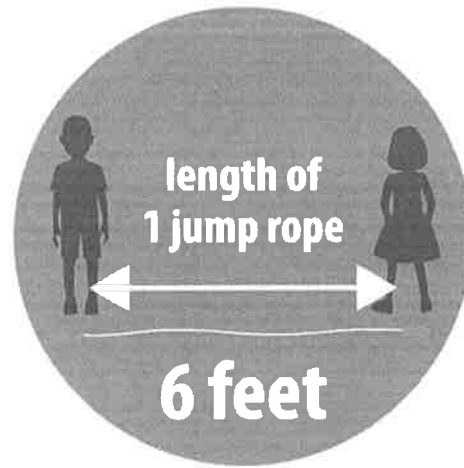

### **Visitors Expectations Fact Sheet**

- Visitors are screened for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 prior to resident access and visitation will be refused if the individual(s) exhibits any COVID-19 symptoms or do not pass the screening questions.
- Screening shall consist of both temperature checks and asking screening questions to assess potential exposure to COVID-19 which shall include questions regarding international travel or travel to other states designated under the Commissioner's travel advisory.
- Documentation must include the following for each visitor to the nursing home: first and last name of the visitor; physical (street) address of the visitor; daytime and evening telephone number; date and time of visit; and email address, if available.
- Limited visitation, including, but not limited to, family members, loved ones, representatives from the long-term care ombudsman program (LTCOP).
- No more than 10 percent (10%) of the residents shall have visitors at any one time and only two visitors will be allowed per resident at any one time.
- At this time, visitation is strictly prohibited in resident rooms or care areas with the exception of parents and immediate family members visiting a pediatric resident (up to age 21) on a dedicated pediatric unit/wing when such room is only occupied by the child receiving a visit.
- Visitation should be limited to outdoor areas, weather permitting. Under certain limited circumstances, as defined by the facility, visitation can be inside, in a well-ventilated space with no more than 10 individuals who are appropriately socially distanced and wearing a facemask or face covering while in the presence of others.
- Visitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older.
- Visitors must wear a face mask or face covering which covers both the nose and mouth at all times when on the premises of the NH/ACF's.
- Visitors must maintain social distancing, except when assisting with wheelchair mobility.
- Facilities will provide alcohol-based hand rub, consisting of at least 60 percent (60%) alcohol, to residents, visitors and representatives of the long-term care ombudsman prior to visiting the residents. Rub hands together using friction.
- Visitation hours are by appointment only. A copy of the NH's/ACF's formal visitation plan is posted on the website and broadcasted via email.
- The staff is required to monitor the visitation process. If any visitor fails to adhere to the protocol, he/she/they will be prohibited from visiting for the duration of the COVID-19 state declared public health emergency.
